NRN Survey: COVID-19's Impact on Family Medicine

The AAFP National Research Network (NRN) has partnered with the Larry A. Green Center and the Robert Graham Center to conduct weekly surveys of physicians to better understand and measure the capacity of physicians, staff and practices during the COVID-19 pandemic and their response to it. The survey's goals are to learn how physicians and their practices are being affected by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic (for example, questions relate to financial implications, treatment of COVID-19, and the overall impact of the pandemic, etc.) and follow trends over time. Physician Immigration Letters Sent to Congress

In keeping with the AAFP's long term-support for international medical graduates and the key role they play in the primary care delivery system in this country, the AAFP sent letters to the [House](https://www.aafp.org/dam/AAFP/documents/advocacy/workforce/gme/LT-House-VisaExtension-051320.pdf) (LINK TO: <https://www.aafp.org/dam/AAFP/documents/advocacy/workforce/gme/LT-House-VisaExtension-051320.pdf>) and [Senate](https://www.aafp.org/dam/AAFP/documents/advocacy/workforce/gme/LT-Senate-VisaExtension-051320.pdf) (LINK TO: <https://www.aafp.org/dam/AAFP/documents/advocacy/workforce/gme/LT-Senate-VisaExtension-051320.pdf>) sponsors of the Healthcare Workforce Resilience Act (H.R. 6788). If passed, this act would recapture 15,000 unused employment-based physician immigrant visas from prior fiscal years for use during the COVID-19 pandemic to help address physician shortages in areas hit hard by the crisis. The letters also call for reauthorizing and expanding the Conrad 30 J-1 visa waiver program beyond the crisis.

We need more family physicians fighting this pandemic, and many of you contacted us about the importance of this issue. We appreciate your thoughtful advocacy in this crucial area. You can continue to make your voice heard on issues of importance to family medicine and to share the impact COVID-19 is having on your practice. I also want to share a few important reminders with you:

- **Prescription medications for COVID-19:** This week, hydroxychloroquine has been back in the news as a drug that could potentially treat or prevent COVID-19. As we know, there are no proven treatments or preventive medications for COVID-19. In April, the AAFP issued a policy on the use of prescription medications for COVID-19 (LINK TO: https://www.aafp.org/dam/AAFP/documents/patient_care/public_health/AAFP-COVID-Medication-Policy.pdf). In addition, we have a few resources on familydoctor.org (LINK TO: <https://familydoctor.org/>) that you may find helpful if you get questions from patients, so be sure to check those out.
- **Town Hall replay:** At last night's virtual Town Hall, our guest was fellow family physician Daniel Lewis, MD. He shared his experiences as a doctor turned patient when he found himself hospitalized with COVID-19.
